NASA's MN Space Grant Consortium (MnSGC) Undergraduate Scholarship Application Instructions

Re: MnSGC Undergraduate Scholarships

Below are instructions to apply for a MnSGC Undergraduate Scholarship. (Please note that MnSGC scholarship awards can only be given to U.S. citizens.)

To apply, fill out two on-line forms linked at https://mn-sgc.submittable.com/submit. The first form is the MnSGC "Student Information Form." The second form is the MnSGC "Student Application General Form." In the latter (generic) form:

- Answer "MnSGC Spring 2021 scholarship application at the U of MN Twin Cities" when asked "What are you applying for?"
- Upload a personal statement (one page max, typed, double-spaced) describing your educational and career goals and how they relate, directly or indirectly, to NASA's Vision for Space Exploration and/or to NASA's interest in increasing gender and ethnic diversity in the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) workforce. - Upload an unofficial copy of your U of MN transcript in .pdf form.
- A letter of recommendation from a professor or U of MN academic advisor is required. Provide their name, department/title, and e-mail address (and tell them <u>in advance</u> to expect to be contacted requesting a letter in support of your MnSGC scholarship application). Letters of recommendation are due by January 31, 2021.

Scholarship recipients will be chosen from among those applicants who have been very successful in their past educational endeavors (typically the GPA cutoff is 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, but we will consider applicants with somewhat lower GPA's who are particularly strong in other areas) and whose area of study and career goals align with NASA's goals in space science/engineering. Applicants must be full-time students at one of the MnSGC affiliate schools, such as the U of MN – Twin Cities, and must be U.S. citizens.

Please note that emphasis is placed on applicants who share areas of interest with NASA. Therefore, applications from potential practitioners in the health, medical, and veterinary fields are <u>not</u> sought unless their career goals can clearly be identified as supporting NASA's mission and/or they can help increase the diversity in the STEM workforce.

The application deadline for this scholarship opportunity is <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>January 27</u>, <u>2021</u> (with recommendation letters due by January 31, 2021). Scholarship decisions will be made in early February and awards will be disbursed to U of MN student accounts and may be used to help pay educational expenses during the spring semester.
